EDITORIAL
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Balance of Payments of the Kyrgyz Republic

"Balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic" is issued by the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic. The legislative basis for the balance of payments are the Law of the Kyrgyz Republic as of July 29, 1997 No. 59 "On the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic" and the Resolution of the Government of the Kyrgyz Republic as of November 3, 2000 No. 645 "On measures to improve statistics of the balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic". This document reflects last tendencies in external sector development and shows statistical data on the balance of payments, external trade, international reserves, external debt and international investment position, as well as compiling methodology and informational database of balance of payments. This document is published 4 times a year – in January, May, July and October and has 3 language versions: Kyrgyz, Russian and English.

This publication provides the revised data on direct investments for 2015. Moreover, starting from the publication for the first quarter of 2016:

- the data on the foreign trade operations comprise additional estimates of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic for exports;*
- the data on the international reserves of the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic were revised according to the IMF methodology, thereunder only the assets in convertible currencies were included in the international reserve assets. The assets in other currencies were presented as other assets in "other investments" item;*
- the reference period, which is used for calculation of the REER (real effective exchange rate) index, was revised;*
- preliminary version of the analytical form of the balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic compiled on the basis of BPM 6 methodology was provided.*

Last day for update of data for the present publication is October 20, 2016.

Annotation symbols and notes:

- ... means the absence of data;
- means, that indicators/ratios are equal to 0 (zero) or insignificant;
- is set between years or months (e.g., 1994-1996 or January-June) and means, that all years and months are covered by the shown dates.

Deviations in last digits may occur because of rounding numbers when summing up.

In regard with the possible changes in accounting methods or historical data, which are used in the given document, correction of earlier published data is acceptable. Therefore, 10 years period can be accounted as "open period".


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THE CURRENT STATE OF THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

(in percent to GDP²)




According to the results of the first half of 2016, the current account¹ formed negative and amounted to USD 426.4 million (a decrease by 18.2 percent) or 10.2 percent to GDP². A reduction in the current account deficit was due to the improved balance of services and income and the positive dynamics of the current transfers.

TRADE BALANCE

According to the results of the first half of 2016, increase in the deficit of trade balance was due to an outrunning dynamics of the decline in exports as opposed to the decline of imports.

Negative **trade balance¹** of the Kyrgyz Republic in FOB prices in January-June 2016 was formed in the amount of USD 1,032.6 million, having increased by 11.1 percent as compared to the similar indicator of 2015. Meanwhile, the ratio of the trade balance to GDP decreased from 35.8 percent to 33.8 percent in the reporting period.

The **external trade turnover** in FOB prices decreased by 14.2 percent as compared to January-June 2015 and formed at the level of USD 2 379.8 million.

Export of goods in FOB prices was formed in the amount of USD 673.6 million, having decreased by 27.0 percent as compared

to the similar indicator of January-June 2015. **The export excluding gold** in the reporting period constituted USD 451.8 million, having decreased by 11.6 percent as compared to the corresponding indicator of 2015.

The export excluding gold and the NBKR additional estimates decreased by 2.1 percent and constituted USD 425.7 million.

The specific weight of the item "goods and operations not included in other SITC sections" decreased, primarily due to a reduction in the supplies on major item - gold. As a result, the specific weight of this section deceased by 14.5 percent and constituted 43.2 percent. The export of gold decreased significantly against decline in the supplies of almost all other commodity groups. However, more significant downward dynamics in the export of other groups conditioned insignificant increase of their specific weights in the total structure of exports by SITC sections. Moreover, an increase in the specific weight of the group "manufactured goods classified chiefly by material" was due to growth in the supplies of iron and steel, whole bovine skin leather.

The exports of the products of **manufacturing industry** and **agriculture** remained the most significant categories; however, in the first half of 2016, they decreased as compared to the same period of 2015. The downward dynamics resulted from the reduction in the production output of the metallurgical, textile and garment industry. In January-June 2016, the decrease in the production of basic metals and manufactured metal products by 36.7 percent as compared to January-June 2015 was due to significant reduction of the precious metals production³. This factor affected the decline in the value of gold exports by 46.1 percent⁴. The decline in the value of gold exports was due to the reduction in the physical volume by 45.8 percent and insignificant fall in the contractual prices⁵. In general, decrease in the value was observed on all goods items of the group excluding "iron and steel", on this item growth made USD 6.0 million.

The reduction in the output of the textile industry and clothing manufacture by 22.1 percent was due to the decrease in the production output of the outdoor clothing for men and women, as well as articles of textile fabrics⁶. As a result, the exports of clothes and clothing accessories decreased by 16.6 percent and amounted to USD 25.0 million. In the reporting period, there was a decrease in exports on almost all items of the group. Meanwhile, the most significant changes in the supplies was observed on the item "articles of textile fabrics for women and girls" (a decrease by USD 17.4 million) and "articles of textile fabrics, knitted and crocheted for men and boys" (an increase by USD 18.3 million).

Despite growth in gross output of the agricultural products in January-June of the current year due to increased production in the livestock sector, there was a reduction in the exports of livestock production during the reporting period. Moreover, rise in the value of supplies on the items "vegetables" and "fruit and nuts" was due to an increase in the export contractual prices.

The specific weight of the non-CIS countries (52.9 percent) prevailed in the geographic structure of export. Switzerland remained the most significant trade partner despite a decline in its specific weight down to 25.5 percent. Turkey and the United Arab Emirates were other significant trade partners from the non-CIS countries. The precious metals and agricultural products were primarily supplied to these countries.

The gross share of the EEU countries in the total volume of exported goods increased up to 36.4 percent. The structure of goods exported to the EEU countries was presented by the textile industry products and the agricultural products. In terms of the EEU individual countries, the Russian Federation and the Republic of Kazakhstan are the main consumers of domestic exported goods.

In general, the Kyrgyz Republic exported goods to 76 countries in the reporting period (in January-June 2015 the export was carried out to 81 countries).

In January-June 2016, significant decline in the supplies of items from the section "mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials" was observed in the **goods structure** of import. As a result, the specific weight of this group decreased by 10.6 percentage points and constituted 11.5 percent. The petroleum products are the most significant item in this group. In the reporting period, imports of the petroleum products decreased by 56.2 percent, down to USD 157.4 million, primarily due to a decline in the supplies of the major items of the group – motor spirit and gas oil. A decrease in the value of exports of the petroleum products was due to a decline of the contractual prices by 38.4 percent and a decrease of the physical volumes by 28.9 percent.

The supplies of the commodity group "machinery and transport equipment", the specific weight of which constituted 23.6 percent in the goods structure of imports by the SITC sections, increased by 4.2 percent in the total volume of imports. In the goods structure, the increase in the supplies was observed on the items "electrical apparatus for line telephony or line telegraphy", "parts and accessories for motor vehicles" and others.

In the goods structure of import by the SITC sections in the reporting period the specific weight of the section "miscellaneous manufactured articles" was 19.7 percent. In January-June 2016, the value of the imported items of this section increased by USD 177.0 million. This dynamics was primarily determined by the growth of imported clothes, clothing accessories and footwear from China. An increase in the volume of imports was observed on all major imported items of the section.

The specific weight of the "manufactured goods classified chiefly by material" increased by 2.0 percentage points and constituted 18.8 percent of the total volume of imported goods. In the goods structure of this section, the most significant changes were observed on the item "iron and steel" and "fabrics, woven of man-made textile materials".

In general, a decrease of the value due to a reduction of the physical volume of imports and import prices was observed on the majority of goods from this group.

In the geographic distribution of imports, the specific weight of the non-CIS countries increased by 57.6 percent (up to USD 1,046.0 million) due to increase in the supplies of consumer goods. China, the specific weight of which in the reporting period constituted 63.9 percent of the total volume of exports, remained the key trade partner of the Kyrgyz Republic among the non-CIS countries.

The specific weight of the goods supplied from the EEU countries constituted 39.1 percent. Traditionally, the fuel and energy products were primarily imported from the EEU countries in the reporting period. The Russian Federation was the main supplier of petroleum products. Besides petroleum products from the EEU countries, an increase was observed in the supplies of consumer goods.

In general, the import to the Kyrgyz Republic in the reporting period was carried out from 119 countries of the world (in January-June 2015 – from 127 countries).



BALANCE OF INTERNATIONAL SERVICES

The increase in the exports of services against the reduction in the imports thereof conditioned decreased deficit of the international services balance.

(millions of USD)



the first half of 2015. At the same time, there was an increase in the export of transport services by 7.6 percent (due to increase in the motor vehicle transport services), whereas, the volume of import transactions decreased by 20.8 percent (due to increase in the railway transport services). The reduction in imports of used cars due to changes in the import conditions was among the factors that influenced the decrease in imports of railway transport services. It should be noted that used cars are mainly imported into the country by rail.

Net export of business services within the reporting period was found positive and constituted USD 16.3 million, having increased by USD 10.8 million as compared to the indicator of 2015. The main factor that affected the import and export of business services in the reporting period was the change in the volume of the consultation services.

According to the results of the first half of the current year, the turnover of international services decreased by 2.1 percent and constituted USD 782.4 million.

At the end of the first half of 2016, **balance of international services** was negative and constituted USD 86.4 million against USD 150.1 million in the corresponding period of 2015. At the same time, there was a decrease in the import of services by 8.5 percent, whereas the volume of services provided by the residents of the Kyrgyz Republic to non-residents increased by 7.2 percent.

In the reporting period the **export of services** constituted USD 348.1 million, which corresponds to 51.7 percent from the volume

In the first half of 2016, the main services were as before travels, transport and business services, which in total constituted 85.9 percent of the turnover of international services.

According to the results of the reporting half of the current year, the balance of the item "travels" was negative and amounted to USD 18.3 million, against the positive balance in the amount of USD 10.9 million in the same period of 2015.

In the reporting period, the balance of transport services was found negative and constituted USD 38.4 million, which is by 34.3 percent lower than the same indicator of

INCOMES

Dynamics of the item "incomes" was defined mainly by the change in the volume of incomes on direct investments in the reporting period.

According to the results of the first half of 2016, the balance of the item "incomes" was negative in the amount of USD 113.0 million, which is by 35.2 percent lower than the similar indicator of 2015. This tendency is mainly a result of reduction in the volume of re-invested income of the entities from USD 132.7 million to USD 33.4 million. The volume of distributed income of the resident-entities in the form of dividends in favor of foreign direct investors increased and constituted USD 45.6 million.

In the reporting period, the volume of interest payment on the previously received loans decreased insignificantly and constituted USD 35.5 million. The volume of incomes received by the residents of the country on other investments in the first half of 2016 decreased and constituted USD 9.5 million. As a result, the deficit of the item "incomes on other investments" decreased by 7.8 percent (to USD 26.1 million).

According to the results of January-June 2016, the balance of the item "remuneration" was found negative in the amount of USD 8.0 million and decreased by 16.0 percent, which resulted mainly from the decrease in the aggregate volume of non-resident income from labor activities in the Kyrgyz Republic.

TRANSFERS

The volume of revenues on the item "current transfers" increased, which has become the result of growth in the net inflow of remittances of labor migrants.

Positive balance of **current transfers** according to the results of 2016 constituted USD 805.6 million, having increased as compared to the similar level of 2015 by 9.9 percent.

The impact on the current transfer account was made by **official** and **private transfers** (other sectors), the net inflow of which increased by 26.8 percent and by 9.1 percent, respectively.

In the structure of private transfers, as before, the main value have the workers' remittances, the specific weight of which in the gross volume of private transfers constituted 98.5 percent. According to the results of the first half of 2016, increase in the net inflow of remittances was due to the increase in the gross inflow thereof by 6.9 percent, meanwhile, the outflow of remittances decreased by 6.4 percent.



The money transfer systems⁷ remain the main mode of labor migrants remittances to the country. In the first half of 2016, the net volume of funds received from the money transfer systems constituted USD 683.2 million⁸, which is by 10.4 percent higher than the similar indicator of 2015. The geographic structure of remittances remains almost unchanged. According to the results of the reporting period, the main share of money transfers was received from the Russian Federation (96.9 percent). In the structure of remittances made from the Kyrgyz Republic, the prevailing specific weight also falls on the Russian Federation (99.0 percent).

Money transfers remained the main source of financing the trade deficit. The balance of transfers still covered net export of consumer goods, which in turn formed with a negative value of USD 521.5 million.


In the first half of 2016, the balance of current transfers in the **sector of state governance** was found positive in the amount of USD 43.4 million, which is by 26.8 percent higher than the corresponding indicator of 2015. Increase in the inflow of official transfers was mainly due to the growth in the volume of grants received by the state sector. In the reporting period, the volume of paid membership fees to the international organizations increased up to USD 2.4 million.

CAPITAL AND FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS ACCOUNT

The positive balance of the capital and financial transactions account increased due to recovery of the net inflow on the item "other investments".

According to the results of the first half of 2016, the **capital and financial transactions account** was formed with a positive balance in the amount of USD 621.6 million, which is by USD 580.9 million higher than the corresponding indicator of the same period in 2015.

The balance of the **capital transactions account** was formed positive in the amount of USD 68.3 million, having increased by USD 41.8 million compared to the level of the same period in 2015. Increase in the indicators of the reporting period was mainly due to a debt in the amount of USD 30 million released by the Russian Federation⁹. Moreover, the volume of grants received within the

framework of the public investment program increased by USD 8.0 million.

Financial account according to the results of the first half of 2016 was formed with a positive balance in the amount of USD 553.2 million, which is by USD 539.1 million more as compared to January-June 2015. The financial account was formed under the impact of the capital inflow on the items "direct investments" and "other investments".

According to the results of six months of 2016, the net volume of funds attracted to the country on the item "direct investments" constituted USD 293.5 million. Decrease of the residents' foreign assets abroad and increase of the liabilities to non-residents influenced the formation of the positive balance of this article.

In the reporting period, residents' assets decreased by USD 212.9 million mainly due to the decrease of the commercial banks' foreign assets by USD 92.2 million and the reduction of residents' "other" foreign assets by USD 120.7 million. In the reporting period, residents' assets placed on their accounts with the foreign banks decreased by USD 58.8 million. Moreover, the volume of accounts receivable increased by USD 52.3 million. As of the end of June 2016, more than 64.2 percent in the total volume of accounts payable fell on the enterprises of manufacturing industry, and the organizations that deal with the supply of electric energy and gas, professional, scientific and technical activity.

A rise in the liabilities of the country's residents was primarily due to the gross inflow of credits to the public and the private sector (by USD 201.9 million and USD 173.0 million, respectively). Meanwhile, the upward trend was still observed in the servicing of previously received loans of the public and private sector, which increased by 89.8 and 50.9 percent, respectively as compared to the same period of the previous year. As a result, the net inflow of loans in the reporting period was formed with a positive balance and amounted to USD 51.5 million.

In the reporting period, the volume of accounts payable of the resident entities increased by USD 56.4 million against a negative value in the previous year. In general, the prevailing specific weight in the total volume of accounts payable, which make 83.9 percent of the total amount of debt, fell on the organizations that deal with wholesale and retail trade, manufacturing and mining industry, information and communication, the supply of electric energy and gas.

In the reporting period, the balance of "**portfolio investments**" was formed negative and constituted USD 257.3 million, having increased by 28.9 percent compared to the first half of 2015. This trend was mainly formed due to the decrease in the volume of transactions on direct foreign investments of the residents abroad down to USD 36.9 million, which amounted to USD 133.8 million in the same period of 2015. In the structure of direct foreign investments to the country, the decrease was observed to the share capital by 56.3 percent and the reinvested capital - by 74.9 percent, meanwhile, the increase by USD 86.4 million was observed on other direct investments.

In the reporting period, by types of economic activity the highest net inflow of direct investments to the country was observed in the entities that deal with the manufacturing industry, provision (supply) of electric energy, gas and steam, as well as the business entities involved in the sphere of construction, scientific and technical activity. In the geographic structure of direct investments, a decrease in the inflow of the capital from China, the Russian Federation and Canada prevail.

Thus, according to the results of the first half of 2016, **the overall net balance of payments** was formed positive in the amount of USD 289.5 million.

The balance of the item "**Errors and omissions**", taking into account the additional estimates of the

National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic, was formed positive in the amount of USD 94.4 million, which proves insufficient statistic recording of transactions related to the inflow of capital to the country or export of goods and services.

The volume of the international reserve assets¹⁰ as of June 30, 2016 constituted 1,801.9 million, which covers 4.6¹¹ months of the future import of goods and services.

Table of the Balance of Payments of the Kyrgyz Republic according to the 6th Edition of the Balance of Payments and International Investment Position Manual

Currently, the balance of payments statistics is compiled by the National Bank of the Kyrgyz Republic in accordance with the requirements of the International Monetary Fund's Balance of Payments Manual, the fifth edition (IMF, 1993). However, in order to meet the new international standards, the National Bank takes measures on compiling the external sector statistics based on the IMF's new methodology – the Balance of Payments Manual, the sixth edition (hereinafter referred to as the BPM 6).

This box provides the users with a preliminary version of the analytical form of the balance of payments of the Kyrgyz Republic compiled on the basis of BPM 6 methodology.

Given that the BPM 6 maintains succession with the methodology of the fifth edition, the balance of payments statistics, which are based on the methods of the fifth edition, generally, remain comparable with the data compiled based on the new methods. At the same time, the meaning of the balance of payments accounts changed as some items of the balance of payments were regrouped in accordance with the BPM 6.

The presentation form of the balance of payments statistics, formerly based on the credit (plus) and debit (minus) entries was changed in the provisional version of the balance of payments. Credit and debit operations are registered with a sign "+" in the current account and the capital account. Meanwhile, the balance of the corresponding items (goods, services, primary income, and secondary income) is defined as a difference between the credit and debit.

The notions "net acquisition of financial assets" and "net incurrence of liabilities" are used instead of "assets" and "liabilities" in the financial account. Net acquisition of assets is equal to the increase in assets after deduction of the decrease in assets. Net incurrence of liabilities is equal to the increase of liabilities after deduction of the decrease in the liabilities. Change with a sign "+" indicates the increase in the assets or liabilities, and change with a sign "-" indicates the decrease in the assets or liabilities. In accordance with the fifth edition of the Balance of Payments Manual, the increase in the asset was registered with a sign "-", the decrease in the assets - with a sign "+".

Statistical discrepancies (the item "Errors and omissions") are obtained as a residual value that brings into balance the positive or negative balances resulting from summing the operations registered in the balance of payments. A positive value of statistical differences indicates the capital inflows into the country or export of goods, which are statistically unrecorded. A negative value indicates the capital outflows from the country or imports of goods, which are statistically unrecorded.

Full data compiling of the balance of payments and the international investment position in accordance with the BPM 6 methods shall be implemented in 2016-2017.

¹⁰ In accordance with the IMF methodology, the international reserve assets comprise the assets only in convertible currencies (US dollar, euro, British pound, Japanese yen, Swiss franc, Australian dollar and Canadian dollar).


Chart I.1. Nominal and Real Effective Exchange Rate Indices
